PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Provo High Patrons,

It is with mixed feelings that I leave Provo High School. I started at Provo High School as an assistant principal in 1994 (before more than half of the current students were born). In 2000, I became principal of Farrer Middle School, then returned to Provo High as principal in 2004. All of my children attended all four years at Provo High School and my youngest graduates from PHS with me next month. Provo High has been our family's home away from home for decades.

Provo High School has an unequalled tradition of excellence. Our alumni are as great as any school in the nation. Our faculty, staff and families are superb. Provo High's greatest attributes however, are our students. Provo High students strive for excellence. Provo High School students graduate with a bright future; prepared for success. Although Provo High School has faced enormous challenges in recent years, below are listed a few examples of the great things we have accomplished together.

This year Provo High started an underclass honors program to ensure all students wishing to complete college credit during their high school are prepared for college level work in Advanced Placement, Concurrent Enrollment, Distance Learning and IB by their junior year. Freshman Honors is open to all students willing to rise to the challenge.

Provo High School became the first and only International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IB) in Utah County. Our IB diploma recipients have become state Sterling Scholar winners, and received full ride scholarships at the most prestigious universities, where they earn scholastic honor. IB is open to prepared students, who are willing to work hard.

Provo Academic Unified Studies (PAUS) is for any student who prefers hands-on learning. PAUS students travel the state, experiencing history, reflecting through reading and writing, walking through geological formations and practice living a healthy lifestyle. Upperclassmen earn English, Science, US History and PE/Health credit in this program. Provo has many options to learn in ways that match student's interest and abilities.

This year Provo began the Provo Unlimited Progress (PUPs); an accelerated learning program for academically gifted 7th and 8th graders. Students must be highly gifted to qualify for this program. They receive specialized instruction from gifted certified teachers, math up to Calculus, seven language options, age appropriate activities, and fine arts experiences only available at the high school. PUPs has been a great experience for students who need this specialized service.

Provo High students have also been very successful in many region and state athletic championships, club competition national winners, top performing arts programs in Utah / US, winners of Art competitions, science fairs, and several state Sterling Scholar winners. Overall, I have enjoyed these years serving your children.

Recognition: The IB seniors will be recognized at the Senior Awards ceremony on May 24. Please plan to attend and receive your award so everyone can see who the IB kids are at our school!

Summer: All IB candidates for next year need to be aware that many IB classes have summer work that needs to be completed. Let’s get a good start on next year. Some examples are:

-**Biology** holds a mandatory summer academy June 6-9 from 11:30 – 1:00. Get details from Mrs. Williams or check the IB room.

-For **20th Century Topics** with Mrs. Hendricks, students need to choose a historical topic in the 20th century they would like to study for their IA and find resource materials.

-Dr. Fodermaier has requested the following for her IB language classes - **IB German:** Buy and translate "Der Kleine Prinz"; **IB French:** Buy and translate "Le Petit Prince"; **IB Latin:** Buy and translate "The Aeneid" by Vergil; these books can be found at Borders, Barnes and Nobles or ordered on Amazon.com.

-Senior diploma candidates need to choose a topic and an advisor for their **Extended Essay**, and get that information to Mr. Ricci before May 25. Your first draft of the essay will be due August 22, the first day back to school.

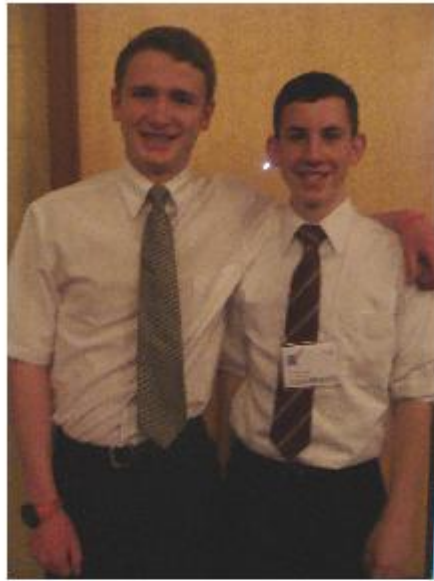
