- Distance Education and Concurrent Enrollment college courses require different learning strategies than regular high school classes. The information on this page is intended to help students evaluate skills to achieve success in this new learning environment.

Self Motivation and Discipline

- Distance Education and Concurrent Enrollment college courses are more rigorous than regular high school courses.
- Class lectures and exams are not altered for high school vacation days, athletic events, or any other extra-curricular activities. The student is responsible for contacting the college professor before the event to correlate any missed material.
- Assignments must be turned in correctly and on time for credit.

Asking for Help

- In a college setting, it is not the instructor's responsibility to ask the student if they are falling behind or not understanding the material being taught.
- It is the student's responsibility to recognize and ask for help when needed.
- Resources for help can include: Peer tutoring, Instructor/Teaching Assistants, Tutoring Labs, Parents or Guardians, other campus resources.

Record Keeping

- Keep a copy of all assignments that are submitted, as well as anything that is returned from the professor until after your final grade is posted.
- Check grades weekly for assignments and tests on Canvas to make sure they are posted correctly.
- The student is responsible to contact the college professor if there are grades missing or if assignments/exams are scored incorrectly.

Communication with the Instructor

- Communication in Distance Education courses needs to be initiated by the student to the instructor.
 - This can be done through email, over the ednet system, by phone, or in person by appointment.
